FROM THE COMMANDER

On Saturday of our November drill, the regimental commander, COL Lander, visited the Atk Trp to introduce himself to some of the unit officers and NCO's and to observe training and the BTMS workshops. While he was here, we also discussed our unit training plan for the next year. The Atk Hel Trp will attend Annual Training with the 107th Armored Cavalry Regiment at Camp Grayling, Michigan, 13-28 June 1981. This is firm so plan ahead. Most importantly, this A.T. period will give us our first opportunity to operate as an organic maneuver unit and to demonstrate our own capabilities and professionalism. WHAT'S HAPPENING THIS WEEKEND
