### FROM THE COMMANDER

In the October 1981 newsletter I stated that because of our punishing training schedule and other administrative requirements that "No one could claim they are under-challenged this year". Four months later (and a lot of sweat) I believe that most of you would agree that that statement has plenty of merit. We have done well so far but there is much to do. We have been successful at accomplishing each task as they occurred, the latest being the Command Inspection held during the January drill. The Regimental Commander, Colonel Lander, and his staff had many laudatory comments about the unit, the knowledgeable individuals they encountered at the sections inspected and the overall esprit and enthusiasm exhibited by the unit members. For those comments we are most thankful but they also found many areas that could be improved or needed correcting. We have already begun the implementation of the staff's suggestions and recommendations. Behind us now are the COMET and Command Inspections and the November exercise.

The next major endeavor we face is the MOBEX (Mobilization Exercise) to be conducted during the February drill. This exercise is being administered to our unit by the 100th MTC from Louisville, Kentucky. The exercise itself will only involve about 20 unit members (primarily all leadership positions). However, so that everyone else won't feel left out, we have been requested to accomplish some other mandatory requirements that are associated with a mobilization.

You will be awakened that morning by a friendly wake-up call from your supervisor (which will be done to test our alert roster) and you will be required to bring all of your military clothing and field gear if you are enlisted, and field gear if you are an officer. All individuals issued flight gear will be required to bring that in also. This will constitute our annual showdown inspection. After the clothing showdown, equipment is exchanged, and the new clothing forms are signed, it will be business as usual: flying and SQT preparations. We will have State Auditors and other visitors monitering the accomplishment of these tasks, so all I can ask for is maximum participation and

## RULES FOR SOLDIER OF THE MONTH BOARD MEMBERS

- 1) A Duty Roster will be posted naming two E-5's and two E-6's as Board Members for each quarter.
- 2) Each board member will report to the Board President at 1200 hours at each drill Sunday during the quarter.
- 3) Only the Board President will release the board members to their sections.
- 4) Alternates will be assigned to replace board members if necessary.
- 5) Members selected for the board will allocate four hours on the Sunday drill for board functions as necessary.
- 6) A soldier can only be nominated once every quarter.
- 7) Each nominee must have a handwritten or typed letter of recommendation.
- 8) Each nominee will report to the Orderly Room at 1300 hours each Sunday of the drill.
- 9) If a nominee fails to appear, he is disqualified for selection.
- 10) If a Platoon Sergeant or Section Sergeant fails to insure his nominee is at the Orderly Room at 1300 hours on Sunday, he must submit in writing to the First Sergeant why the nominee was not there.
- 11) The nominee must have been in the Attack Troop a minimum of three drills.

## EXPLANATION OF INACTIVE DUTY FOR TRAINING (IDT) LEAVE AND EARNINGS STATEMENT (LES)

The LES is a computer-produced monthly statement of account for each soldier paid by the Joint Uniform Military Pay System - Reserve Component (JUMPS-RC). It shows all entitlements, collections, and payments made during the period covered. Every ARNG soldier should receive an LES on a monthly basis. Detailed block description of the LES is as follows:

1	Name (LAST, FIRST, MI)	Soldier's name as shown on pay file.
2	Unit ID Code	Unit Identification Code - different for every unit in the Army.
	TNG CAT Code	Training Pay Category code. The soldier can receive pay if this code reads A, P or Q.
3	Pay Grade	Pay grade, i.e., 02, W4, E6, etc.
4	Period Covered	The entitlement month.
5	SOC. SEC. NO.	Soldier's 9-digit social security number.
	Net Pay Due	The amount of pay due, after deductions for the entitlement period.
6	Entitlements	Item of pay and the amount of each that the soldier is entitled.
7,11	Allotment Collections	Does not apply to ARNG IDT pay.
8	Other Collections	Items and amounts collected from soldier's pay - Collections other than taxes and insurance should have an explanation in item 39.
9	Amt Brot. Fwd.	Does not apply to ARNG IDT pay.
