#### FROM THE CAS FACTORY

We are all aware that the unit is having an External ARTEP Evaluation at Summer Camp this year, and I'm sure everyone wants to do their part to help the Attack Troop get a passing score. Therefore, I am taking this time to provide some helpful hints for each member so that our weakest training area won't seem so weak.

The following is a list of proficiency standards that the individual members should be aware of to survive and continue the mission in an NBC environment. Each individual must be able to:

a. Recognize nuclear and chemical attacks and take protective actions.

b. Be aware of the effects of a chemical/biological attack and know preventive as well as first-aid measures.

c. Recognize NBC alarms and signals.

d. Recognize the existence of an MBC hazard area and take protective measures.

e. Properly don, seat, and clear your protective mask within 2 seconds; then adjust the hood in an additional 6 seconds following an alarm or recognition of a chemical/biological attack.

f. Follow procedures for removal of protective masks.

g. Take protective measures against initial effects of a nuclear burst.

h. Recognize symptoms and effects of NBC contamination.
i. Perform self-aid and first-aid for contamination.

j. Properly decontaminate yourself and equipment with your decon kits.

k. Properly maintain individual NBC protective equipment in a high state of serviceability.

1. Recognize all standard marking signs indicating MBC contaminated areas.

m. Demonstrate procedures for minimizing dangers while crossing or bypassing NBC contaminated areas.

n. Demonstrate proficiency in performing your primary military duty, to include the use of weapons and vehicles while wearing protective NBC clothing and equipment on a continuous basis.

o. As a unit, take immediate and correct protective measures when warned of an imminent NBC attack, when a nuclear blast occurs, or when warned of the arrival of chemical/biological agent or radiological fallout.

Recent military actions in Lebanon have proven that much of the Soviet arsenal is ineffective against U.S. technology, but the Soviet's still maintain a tremendous lead in the development and deployment of chemical and biological agents. With this discovery, how unlikely do you suppose it is that the use of chemical agents by the Soviet Bloc Nations will not occur? The real question is: What are you doing to insure your survival if any of these agents are ever used?

NBC defense is an individual responsibility and if you feel that you are lacking in any of these areas, we at the Gas Factory have all of the necessary information that you need to survive.

We will do our best to provide this information to you, but, individual

concern and cooperation are needed first.




One thing about this Summer Camp, you'll have the chance to taste the best cabbage rolls anyone can have and boost the Unit Fund at the same time!
